The NAV team at the Royal Alberta Museum is responsible for our Mammalogy, Herpetology and Ichthyology collections. This volunteer role will include a variety of collection related work including processing, cataloguing, organization and photography.

Qualifications

- Knowledge and training in the field of Biology an asset
- Dissecting or animal processing experience an asset
- An attention to detail and thorough documentation skills
- The applicant must be able to carefully handle delicate objects and large specimens
- Basic computer skills (Windows OS) required; with additional database experience an asset
- Basic photography skills

Responsibilities

- Successfully complete required training
- Assist in preparing wet or fluid specimens
- Assist with the preparation of museum study skins
- Assist with the cleaning of skull and skeletal material with dermestid beetles
- Photographing collections
- Organizing collection storage, using barcode scanners to update location information
- With additional training, the volunteer may use our TMS database to update records
